Thanks to a welcome gift from nearby Blue Cliff College, Divine Mercy Community Clinic has opened its doors at last to the poor of Houma. "We're stepping out in faith to provide quality healthcare to those who can't afford it, but still desperately need it," Dr. Allan Weilert observed, "the generosity of many people have made this project possible. We are so grateful for all the Lord has accomplished already!"

Initially, the Clinic will open for several hours each day during the transition to a full-time schedule. To schedule an appointment for chiropractic care, please call Allan at 985/217-6726.

Plans for future expansion include the volunteer expertise of medical doctors, nurses, massage therapists, and other healthcare professions. In addition, the Clinic will serve as a safe place for homeless people to find a bit of relaxation, somewhere to socialize, and enjoy a cool drink and a snack. Prayer meetings, bible studies, and other

growth and development are also envisioned.

Currently, Allan is investigating the funding resources of grants and other ways to support the mission of the Clinic. He is finding that grant-writing is quite a demanding task! Several capable volunteers have offered their services to raise the necessary money for the outreach of the Clinic.

## October—Month of the Most Holy Rosary

*“Any problem, no matter how difficult, can be resolved by praying the Rosary,” Sr. Lucia of Fatima*

Traditionally, the Church has devoted the month of October to fostering prayer of the Rosary. When we pray the Rosary, we are really praying the Gospels; each of the mysteries beckon us more deeply to reflect on important events in the lives of Jesus and Mary. We don’t need to worry that praying the Rosary would ever lead us away from the Lord when the opposite is true; praying the Rosary well makes us better Christians. I think it is a sign of the times that many non-Catholic Christians are now discovering the Rosary!

In the Joyful Mysteries, we meditate on the richness of the Incarnation, God becoming flesh. The Luminous Mysteries urge us to consider the public ministry of Jesus from His Baptism in the River Jordan to the total giving of Himself to us in the Holy Eucharist during the Last Supper. The Rosary’s Sorrowful Mysteries draw us to experience the suffering and death of Our Lord, while the Glorious Mysteries focus us on His Resurrected Life in the Church. What unfathomable treasures the Holy Rosary holds for us, hidden in simple beads, medal, and crucifix! What a gift the Rosary is for us!

When we pray the Rosary, we are calling upon the powerful and effective intercession of Our Lady. The prayers of Our Blessed Mother obtain countless graces and solve seemingly impossible situations most easily. Again and again, I have found this to be true in my life. In fact, the needed funds to finally open our clinic came on the **Feast of the Holy Rosary!** I have never been disappointed by my Mother; she has obtained everything I have asked her for. St. Louis de Montfort calls Mary the “shortest and safest path to Jesus” and directs all souls to entrust, to consecrate themselves totally to Him, through her patronage and intercession. Indeed, *Ad Jesu per Mariam—to Jesus through Mary* is how the Servants of Divine Mercy hope to live. Who has known the Son better than His Mother?

*Dear Mary, bring us closer to Jesus. Melt our hardened hearts with the incomparable love you have for Him. Teach us how to humbly serve Jesus and to see Him in every soul we encounter. Obtain for us a spirit of contemplation to pierce the Mysteries of your Rosary. Bring healing to troubled souls in our families and among our friends. Mother, Queen of Peace, obtain peace for us and for the whole world! Amen.*
