Jesus, I trust in You!

Divine Mercy Spirituality is as old as Salvation History. In revelations during the 1930s to a Polish religious sister, St. Maria Faustina, Our Lord appeared to her as a Risen Savior with rays of Blood and Water radiating from His Sacred Heart. Jesus commanded St. Maria Faustina to paint an Image of this vision and to inscribe it with the signature,

“Jesus, I trust in You.”

Although her attempts at painting an Image failed, since St. Maria Faustina was not an artist, a painter was commissioned to produce the first Image of Divine Mercy, which is venerated in the church where she is buried in Poland.
